1. READ READ POEMS

Borrow poetry books from your library. Find poetry books in Charity Shops. Try to use a small dictionary and thesaurus when writing. Treat both of them as your best writing friends..

2. COLLECT

INTERESTING WORDS CONNECTED TO YOUR IDEA

VERBS AND ADVERBS

BLEND TOGETHER
SPEAK AND LISTEN TO YOUR WORDS

Can you: Hear the sea? Touch the sand? See the beach? Smell the seaweed? Taste the salt?

Look for comparisons e.g. similes*
Listen for word melodies e.g. alliteration*

3. SELECT

The type of poem you want to write. Is it?

- a story poem such as a ballad*
- a haiku*
- a shape poem*
- a snapshot poem
- a descriptive poem using short lines, long lines, mixture of both.
- an acrostic*

Create a picture with your selected words
What do you want your poem to tell to your reader?

* Search for these words if you need an explanation.

4. REJECT

- Cut out words that are not 'working' for your poem
- Cut out small linking words, dull words, overused words.

5. REVIEW

- Read your words aloud.
- Listen to your words.
- Look at your words.
- Have you painted a word picture?

Does the shape of your poem engage your eyes.
